Independent Assurance Report

1 Subject Matter Information and Criteria

The subject matter information for our assurance is "a report on energy-derived greenhouse gas emissions (Scope 1, Scope 2 (Calculated value applying average emission factor for all power sources and Calculated value applying base emission factor)) "covering the operations and activities of the Company in Japan (624 domestic sites) described in "FY2022 GHG Emissions Calculation Report" (period: 1 April 2022 to 31 March 2023).
